- **285** visitors were selected as emerging leaders by the U.S. State Department and hosted by WACNH in federal fiscal year 2012;
- 2 delegations from former Soviet Union countries spent 10 days in NH, staying in local homes;
- 137 individuals, businesses and non-profits donated time to exchange ideas with their international counterparts on topics ranging from good governance to freedom of the press;
  - **22** people opened their homes to a visitor to share a meal and Granite State hospitality.




